

Elizabeth Taylor serves as the Head of Government Affairs and Economic Development and as Assistant General Counsel. She and her team are responsible for advocating for Regions and its constituents at the local, state and federal level, as well as helping to coordinate and develop regulatory policy and advocacy.

When she joined Regions in 2017, Elizabeth served as Head of Regulatory Policy. Prior to joining Regions, Elizabeth worked for the International Franchise Association as chief legal officer and chief of staff. Before assuming that role, she was a federal lobbyist advocating for franchise businesses on issues including access to capital, tax reform, labor policy, and healthcare. Before joining IFA, Elizabeth spent almost ten years working in the United States Senate, including as chief counsel to three different senators on the Senate Judiciary Committee and as chief counsel for the ranking member of the Privacy, Technology, and the Law Subcommittee. During her time on the committee, she focused on legislation related to data and cyber security, privacy, patents, trade secrets, bankruptcy, criminal law, and immigration. She also handled the confirmations of two U.S. Supreme Court nominations and numerous congressional investigations as well as legislative and oversight matters. Elizabeth began her career in D.C. working for her home state member, U.S. Senator Fred Thompson.

Elizabeth earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science from Rhodes College and a Juris Doctor from American University's Washington College of Law.

Elizabeth is the Vice Chair of the Government Relations Committee of the ABA's Card Policy Council and is an active member of the Women in Housing & Finance organization.
